What is Recombination?

Recombination is a fan-run convention with a broad theme of role-playing, science fiction, fantasy and filk. Strictly speaking, Recombination is three conventions in one, but more of that later. The con will run from Friday 10th - Sunday 12th August 2007, and we're planning a relaxed and interesting weekend filled with plenty of panel discussions, talks, games and music. We will have a dealers' room and a real ale bar and lots of space for gaming and socialising.

Three cons in one

Recombination follows in the footsteps of three well-established small cons. It will be the 2007 British Roleplaying Society convention, a gaming convention in the tradition of Baroquon, Conjunction, Consternation, etc. It will also be Unicon 21, marking the revival of this series of university-based SF and fantasy conventions. We will also host Harmuni 3, a filk convention and child of recent Unicons.

Location

Our venue is New Hall, Cambridge, one of the younger colleges of the University, slightly removed from the hubbub of the city centre. New Hall has hosted a number of Unicons and has long been the venue of choice for BRScos, hosting Baroquon, Rocococon, Conjunction, and Consternation, among others, so we've established a good working relationship with New Hall over the years.



We will be able to offer a range of rooms in the college at very reasonable prices; single rooms sharing bathrooms will cost £40.50 per night, with breakfast; twin and en-suite rooms will also be available. (Please don't try booking yet; forms will be sent out to all members nearer the date).

New Hall has good on-site parking, its own bar, and a variety of meeting rooms suitable for sf and gaming panels, Live-Action Role Playing, tabletop gaming, dealers, and organised convention events.

What is filk?

Filk has been described as "the folk music of the science fiction/fantasy fan community," (Kay Shapero) or "a mixture of song parodies and original music, humorous and serious, about subjects like science fiction, fantasy, computers, cats, politics, the space program, books, movies, TV shows, love, war, death..." (Nick Smith). Real Ale

As well as New Hall's own bar, we will have a real ale bar, stocked from local company Milton Brewery. Founded in 1999, it describes itself as "a traditional English Ale brewery, albeit lurking in the cunning disguise of a 1950s industrial unit".

The full selection of beers will be decided closer to the time, but we plan to have the Minotaur mild and Sparta pale bitter that were most popular at Consternation. We also plan to have real cider in the form of Weston's Old Rosie, but be careful: the steamroller on the label is there as a warning to the unwary! There will also be some food and non-alcoholic drinks available in the real ale bar, and space for people to bring small "beer and pretzels" games into the real ale bar and play them there.

Of course, this will need volunteers, so we'll be after people to work as beer gophers in return for cheap beer and the opportunity to wear a stylish stripy apron. Email the committee if you'd like to help out.

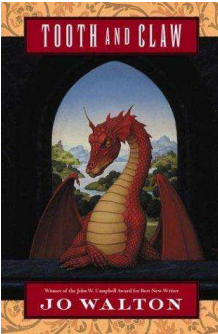
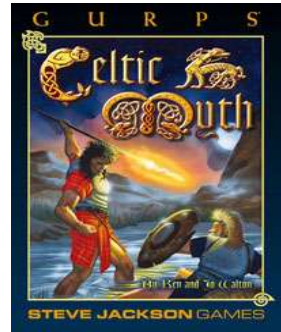


Guests of Honour

Jo Walton

Jo Walton won the John W. Campbell Award for best new writer in 2002 and the World Fantasy Award in 2004. She comes from Wales, but lives in Montreal where the food and books are more varied.

With Ken Walton she co-wrote the *Celtic Myth* sourcebook for GURPS and Warhammer *Realms of Sorcery*, as well as writing for *Arcane* magazine and the *Into the DC* storytelling card games.



Jo's latest novel is the World Fantasy Award winning *Tooth and Claw*, a sentimental Victorian novel about dragons who eat each other. Her earlier works are *The Prize in the Game* and the diptych *The King's Peace* and *The King's Name*. Her alternate history mystery novel *Farthing* will be appearing from Tor in August 2006. She has just finished an odd little fantasy novel called *Lifelode* which is presently in limbo.

She is presently working on a direct sequel to *Tooth and Claw* tentatively entitled *Those Who Favor Fire*; an even more direct sequel to *Farthing* called *Ha'Penny*; a version of *Mansfield Park* set on Mars; and a young adult fantasy about a princess defending a castle from dragons. She treats all these projects, as always, with the seriousness they deserve.

Chris Pramas

Founder of Green Ronin, Chris Pramas began his career in the game industry as a freelance writer in 1994. He made his name working on such game lines as Warhammer Fantasy Roleplay (as a coauthor of *The Dying of the Light*), Feng Shui, and Underground. He started his own company (Ronin Publishing), but later joined Wizards of the Coast as a RPG designer.



He spent four years at Wizards where he eventually became Creative Director for Miniatures R&D. While still at Wizards, he founded Green Ronin Publishing as a side venture and went full-time with Green Ronin on his departure from Wizards. Since then, he has worked as author, developer and producer for Green Ronin on many projects. He has won three Origins Awards and two ENnie Awards for his work. He is best known as the author of the *AD&D Guide to Hell*, *Dragon Fist*, *Death in Freeport* (and its sequels), and most recently as the designer of the acclaimed second edition of Warhammer Fantasy Roleplay (published by Black Industries).

Franklin Gunkelmann

Franklin is an extraordinarily funny and talented musician, always in the thick of it MC-ing and committee-ing at the German filk conventions, and has recently been inducted into the Filk Hall of Fame. We're delighted to have his warm, expressive voice and beautiful piano playing in the limelight at Harmuni in 2007.

Programme

We plan to run all the staple events of a BRSScon, Unicon and Harmuni. Expect guest of honour speeches and interviews, panel discussions on a variety of gaming, SF and fantasy topics, a lively series of concerts and singalongs, a quiz and an auction, plus of course a wide range of tabletop, live action and board games. We have some less conventional plans too; current mad schemes involve late-night storytelling and live-action nethack.
